

The Actual Location of Israel Crossing The Red Sea

The actual location of where Israel crossed the Red Sea was discovered in 1978 by Ron Wyatt and his sons. The site has now been independently confirmed by numerous archeologists. Granite columns were set up by king Solomon to mark the location. The column on the Egyptian side was found by Ron Wyatt lying in the edge of the water and has been put back on its base by Israel. The column on the Saudi

side [which was present when the discovery was made] was removed by Saudi officials because it contained Hebrew inscriptions with king Solomon's name and a description of the crossing [the base where the column was located is still clearly visable]. Corral encrusted chariot wheels are still visible in the waters and metal detectors have verified the metal inside the coral. Coral encrusted chariot wheels in the Gulf of Aqaba.






The split rock is 60 ft tall on top of a hill 300 ft high.

The mount is topped with pinkish granite rock that was blackened by intense heat and pressure.




Mount Jabal al-Lawz, Saudi Arabia
